Three New Bicycle Friendly Businesses in Fitchburg City to Bike to Work with the Mayor to Celebrate

Fitchburg, Wis. – Today, the League of American Bicyclists recognized three Fitchburg business locations with Bronze Bicycle Friendly Business (BFB) awards, earning them places alongside more than 1,200 businesses across the country contributing to the movement to build a more Bicycle Friendly America for everyone.


The new awardees are:

"During Bike to Work Week, we celebrate the businesses making it easier for more people to bike every day," said Bill Nesper, executive director of the League of American Bicyclists. "Bicycle Friendly Businesses like these in Fitchburg aren't just improving commutes — they're transforming communities through meaningful investments in better biking that benefit employees and residents alike."

The Fitchburg awardees join a total of 1,233 current BFBs nationwide, including everything from government agencies, Fortune 500 companies, museums, hospitality establishments, bike shops, and other employers, all united in a commitment to transform American workplaces to be more welcoming to both customers and employees who bike. The Bicycle Friendly Business award recognizes an organization's contributions in shifting up and accelerating the movement to build a Bicycle Friendly America for everyone.

"At the heart of every new Bicycle Friendly Business is a commitment to something greater—community, sustainability, and well-being, to name a few," continued Nesper. "We're proud to celebrate these Fitchburg businesses for their ongoing efforts to champion cycling both within their workplace and in the world around them."

All Fitchburg's new BFBs share base amenities of locations near Fitchburg's low-stress bicycle network, good bicycle parking for visitors, and removal of barriers to biking like prohibitions of bikes in drive-throughs. They benefit from nearby stations for Madison BCycle, the e-bike sharing system serving Madison and Fitchburg, and the Fitchburg Greenway System.

"CAMECA actively supports and promotes bicycling to our employees," said Jesse Olson, Country Director at CAMECA. "This award demonstrates a commitment to making bicycling a safer, more convenient, and enjoyable commute option for employees of all ages here at CAMECA. We believe that encouraging bicycling can lead to a healthier, more engaged workforce. We are happy to accept this award!"

"We operate in a highly competitive housing market, so we design our buildings with unique features that differentiate us from our competitors and make them stand out." said Michael Thorson, Managing Director of Inventure Capital. "Fitchburg is one of the top bike-friendly communities in the country, and we are grateful for its investment in the Fitchburg Greenway System - a network of multi-use, off-street paths - many of which are adjacent to our buildings. We are leveraging that by providing amenities to our tenants to make it easy for them to take advantage of those opportunities. We provide ample and secure bike storage in our parking garages, along with bike repair stations and washing stalls. We are honored to receive this recognition for those efforts, validating the importance of the bicycle amenities we've built."

"The energy of our business community and residents to support biking continues to amaze me," said Julia Arata-Fratta, Mayor of Fitchburg. "Bicycle culture is firmly cemented as a pillar of Fitchburg's identity, for both recreation and transportation. Our recent start down the path to Vision Zero is a great example."

Fitchburg is a six-mile-square city of about 35,000 residents in south central Wisconsin. The southern neighbor of the capital city of Madison, Fitchburg was a town before incorporating in 1983, and so is one-third urban and suburban, and two-thirds rolling glacial farmland and natural areas. Recognized as a Silver level Bicycle Friendly Community in 2015, the city is blessed with three state trails and three mountain bike parks and has developed a dense bicycle transportation network of scenic rural roads, off-road paths, bicycle lanes, and quiet neighborhood streets. Fitchburg's commitment to biking and walking is described in its Bicycle and Pedestrian Plan, adopted in 2017. fitchburgwi.gov
